

報道章程

目的

- 透過考察及研究,以提高學生對香港的歷史發展及其獨特文化遺產 的興趣和認識。
- 提升學生歷史探究能力,培養學生「自主學習」為目標。
- 透過文字或多媒體製作報告,讓學生體驗探究歷史的樂趣。

主題 香港民生行業變!變!變!

香港的各行各業在不同時期經歷興衰及嬗變。十九世紀中葉,造船、煉糖、製纜、染織、水泥磚瓦、麵粉、涼果、醬油等工業生產漸次出現,而與貿易有關的商行、銀行、航運業也急速湧現。二次大戰以後,紡織製衣、塑膠、假髮、電子、鐘錶的輕工業更是蓬勃發展。本比賽主題鼓勵學生可以從社會經濟、政治環境、自然地理等角度切入,設定研究題目,探討式微或已消失的行業,又或在社會發展中衍生出來的新興行業,反映其興衰背景、狀況,乃至對社會民生的影響。

參賽資格

全港中學生均可參賽,可以個人或隊伍名義參賽(每隊最多由五位學生組成),並須由一至兩位老師負責指導。

比賽規則

(1) 比賽分甲、乙兩個項目,每一項目均設初級組(中一至中三)及高級組(中四至中六),每隊不能同時有初中及高中學生隊員。每校參賽報告份數不限,惟同一參賽隊伍只可選擇其中一項目參賽。

甲項:文字報告

參賽作品必須包括:

- (a) **文字報告** 中文或英文均可,以5,000至10,000字為限,必須打印於A4紙上。
- (b) 報告撮要 中文或英文均可,以800字為限,必須打印於A4紙上。
- (c) 註釋及參考書目 中文或英文均可,必須打印於A4紙上。

*上述三項必須連同其複印本(**一份正本,五份副本,共六份**)一併遞交,請於 每份右上角註明參賽編號。



比賽規則 乙項:多媒體製作

參賽作品必須包括:

(a) 多媒體作品

運用多媒體的元素,包括文字、音效、視訊、影像和動畫等,創作一段約5至15分鐘的短片、電腦動畫或電腦遊戲,也可以利用網頁設計等,表達對主題的認識。

作品必須以光碟形式遞交,檔案須能以"Windows Media Player"程式播放或網頁瀏覽器讀取(限Google Chrome或IE 8.0或以上版本,及並不需要安裝或下載額外的外掛程式)。

(b) 設計意念和內容大綱簡介

中文或英文均可,以300至500字為限,必須打印於A4紙上。

- *上述兩項必須連同其複印本(**一份正本,五份副本,共六份**)一併交付,請於每份 右上角註明參賽編號。
- (2) 比賽結束後,主辦機構不會將作品歸還所屬學校,參賽隊伍可自行複製作品作存檔之用。
- (3) 得獎作品(不論任何形式,包括數碼格式)的版權屬主辦單位(香港特別 行政區政府和香港中華文化促進中心)擁有,主辦單位有權將參賽作品 公開使用,並作出版、展覽宣傳或推廣用途,毋須徵求所屬學校和學生 同意。
- (4) 參賽作品必須從未公開發布(包括互聯網),主辦機構亦不接納曾參加 過任何比賽的作品。整體作品,包括風格及設計、音樂、構圖及內容等, 必須為參賽者原創,且不會侵犯任何其他人的任何知識產權權利。 參賽作品如有抄襲之嫌,將被取消資格。
- (5) 主辦機構有權拒絕任何報告參賽或取消其參賽資格而毋須解釋;如有 任何爭議,將由評審委員會作最後決定。
- (6) 主辦機構有權隨時修改以上規定,而毋須事先公布。





評審準則及 程序

(1) 評審會按下列準則就兩項比賽項目分別評分(佔總分90%)

甲項:文字報告

- 資料的蒐集和運用,特別是原始史料(30%)
- 分析能力及表達手法(20%)
- 報告內容是否切合比賽主題(20%)
- 整體製作質素,包括書目和註釋的交代(20%)

乙項:多媒體製作

- 資料的蒐集和表達(30%)
- 作品內容是否切合主題(20%)
- 表達手法及創意(20%)
- 設計意念(10%)
- 整體製作質素(10%)
- (2) 評分工作預計於2019年7月完成。
- (3) 主辦機構在總計作品分數及在選出每項每組不多於四份的優勝作品 後,將會安排學生於2019年7月與評審會面,以便評審對學生的努力 及參與有更深入的認識,並給予評分(佔總分10%)。面試範圍將涉及 下列三方面:
 - 學生對研究主題的認識;
 - 學生的研究方法,特別是史料的蒐集與分析或媒體的表達手法;
 - 學生的分工及協作能力。
- (4) 面試後,評審委員會將根據作品的分數(90%),以及考慮學生的積極性 (10%),決定各組冠軍、亞軍、季軍及優異獎的得獎隊伍。
- (5) 比賽結果將於2019年9月初公布。得獎學校將由主辦機構以書面方式 通知。頒獎典禮將於10月舉行。

參加辦法

- (1) 請於2018年12月14日或之前,將填妥的參賽表格及計劃書寄交九龍石 硤尾白田街30號賽馬會創意藝術中心L4-04香港中華文化促進中心, 信封面請註明「第八屆校際香港歷史文化專題研習比賽」。在截止報 名後一個月內,主辦機構將會審核並確認參賽隊伍所提交的題目。
- (2) 參賽作品必須於2019年5月20日至25日送交九龍石硤尾白田街30號 賽馬會創意藝術中心L4-04香港中華文化促進中心,2019年5月20日 至24日(星期一至五)的辦公時間為上午10時至下午6時,最後收件 時間至2019年5月25日(星期六)下午1時。凡逾時遞交的參賽作品,主 辦機構概不接受。遇有惡劣天氣情況(八號熱帶氣旋警告信號或黑色 暴雨警告信號)時,收件時間將順延至下一個工作天,即2019年5月 27日(星期一)下午6時。

計劃書

- (1) 每隊在提交參加表格時(不論甲項或乙項),均須同時遞交參賽作品 的計劃書,以便評審考核,並提供研究意見,內容須包括以下各點:
 - 題目
 - 內容提綱
 - 研究方法 / 表達手法
 - 搜集資料 / 拍攝方法
 - 工作日程

如有需要,可增添其他項目。

(2) 計劃書以500字為限,中文或英文均可,必須打印於A4紙上。

Aims

- To foster students' awareness of and interest in Hong Kong's historical development and unique cultural heritage through a field project.
- To enhance students' knowledge of and skills in conducting historical research and to implement the principle of "Self-directed Learning".
- To allow students to experience the joy of retracing history through written or multimedia projects.

Theme

Changes in Hong Kong Industries and People's Livelihood

Hong Kong has seen many transformations in the way its inhabitants have earned a living over the years. The mid-19th century saw the establishment of shipyards, sugar refineries, cable manufacturers, dyeing and weaving factories, cement and tile factories, flour mills, as well as preserves and soy sauce factories. Trading companies, banks and hotels thus sprang up to help service their needs. By the 1940s and 1950s, Hong Kong had developed into a city of light industries with flourishing textile and garment, plastics, wig, electronics and timepiece sectors. Students entering this competition are asked to select a research topic from a socioeconomic, political or geographical perspective and then explore in their project historical or new industries that declined or emerged as a result of social developments, with a focus on the context for their rise or fall, their current status and the influence they have exerted on society and people's livelihood.

Eligibility

The competition is open to individual students or a team of not more than five students under the guidance of one to two teachers.

Rules and Regulations

(1) The competition is divided into two categories, A and B, each of which features two divisions: Junior (F.1 - F.3) and Senior (F.4 - F.6). Each team must consist exclusively of students from Junior or Senior classes (i.e. a mix of students from the two divisions in one team is not allowed). There is no limit on the number of entries that a school can submit. However, each team can only choose to enter one of the categories.

Category A: Written Report

The submission should comprise the following items:

(a) Report

In either English or Chinese (5,000-10,000 words), legibly typed and printed on A4 paper.

(b) Abstract

In either English or Chinese (not exceeding 800 words), legibly typed and printed on A4 paper.

(c) Footnotes and bibliography

Legibly typed and printed on A4 paper.

*1 original and 5 copies of each of the items listed above should be submitted. Please mark the entry no. on the upper right corner on each copy.

Category B: Multimedia Production

The submission should comprise the following items:

(a) Multimedia Entry

Create a short 5 to 15-minute video, computer animation or computer game containing multimedia elements such as text, audio effects, videos, images and animation. You may also design a website to convey your knowledge of the topic.

Submit your entry on a disc; the file must be playable on Windows Media Player or in a web browser (Google Chrome and IE 8.0 or above only, no plug-in required).

(b) Concept design and theme

In either English or Chinese (300-500 words), legibly typed and printed on A4 paper.

- *1 original and 5 copies of each of the items listed above should be submitted. Please mark the entry no. on the upper right corner on each copy.
- (2) Entry materials will not be returned to schools and students. Entrants are advised to make copies of their entries before submission.

Rules and Regulations

- (3) The copyright in all formats (including digital) of all winning entries will be granted to the organisers, the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and The Hong Kong Institute for Promotion of Chinese Culture, who will have the right to use all winning entries in any format for publication, exhibition and publicity purposes without obtaining the prior consent of the schools and students concerned.
- (4) All entries should be prepared solely for this competition and may not have been previously distributed in any format (including on the Internet). The entire work of each submission, including sound recordings, graphic design, content, etc., must be the original creation of the participating team and must not infringe the intellectual property rights of any third party. Plagiarism can lead to disqualification.
- (5) The organisers reserve the right to reject or disqualify entries without providing a reason. Should any disputes arise, the decision of the panel of judges will be final.
- (6) The above rules are subject to amendment without prior notice.

Adjudication Criteria and Procedures

1) 90% of the total score will be based on the assessment of the following criteria:

Category A: Written Report

- Systematic use of collected materials, especially the primary source (30%)
- Analysis and presentation of the topics being studied (20%)
- Relevance to the theme of the report and of the competition (20%)
- Overall assessment of quality, including the citation of bibliography and footnotes (20%)

Category B: Multimedia Production

- Systematic use and presentation of collected materials (30%)
- Relevance to the theme of the report and of the competition (20%)
- Creativity of approaches to the topics being studied (20%)
- Overall design concept (10%)
- Overall assessment of quality (10%)
- (2) Adjudication is expected to be completed in July 2019.
- (3) The organisers will shortlist not more than four outstanding reports in each division and category based on the individual scores. The shortlisted teams will be invited to attend an interview in July 2019 to give the judges a deeper understanding of their effort and contribution in conducting the study project. The judges will examine the following aspects in the interview (10% of the total score):
 - Understanding of the research theme
 - Research methods, particularly the collection and analysis of research materials or the use and presentation of multimedia materials
 - Division of labour and collaboration skills
- (4) After the interview, the panel of judges will select the award winners based on the submission (90% of the total score) and the students' degree of participation (10% of the total score).
- (5) The results will be announced in early September 2019. Award winners will be notified in writing. The prize presentation ceremony will be held in October.

Submission

- (1) Please send the completed entry form and project study outline to The Hong Kong Institute for Promotion of Chinese Culture, Unit L4-04, Jockey Club Creative Arts Centre, 30 Pak Tin Street, Shek Kip Mei, Kowloon, by 14 December 2018. Please mark the envelope "The 8th Inter-school Competition of Project Learning on Hong Kong's History and Culture". The comments / opinions of the judges on the outline will be given to schools for students' reference within one month after the closing date for submission.
- (2) Submission must be delivered to The Hong Kong Institute for Promotion of Chinese Culture, Unit L4-04, Jockey Club Creative Arts Centre, 30 Pak Tin Street, Shek Kip Mei, Kowloon, from 20 to 24 May 2019 (Mon to Fri, 10 am - 6 pm). The deadline for submission is 1 pm on 25 May 2019 (Sat). Late submission will NOT be accepted. In the event of any inclement weather conditions (Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No.8 or Black Rainstorm Warning Signal), the deadline will be postponed to 6 pm on 27 May 2019 (Mon).

Project Study Outline

- (1) Each participating team (either Category A or Category B) must submit the study project outline together with the entry form for evaluation. The project outline should include the following items:
 - Area of study
 - Project outline
 - Research method / presentation approach
 - Method of collecting research materials / filming
 - Schedule

Additional items may be submitted with the project outline if necessary.

(2) The project outline should not exceed 500 words in either Chinese or English and should be legibly typed and printed on A4 paper.

Prizes

- (1) The following prizes will be presented to the two categories:

 1st Prize Book coupons worth HK\$5,000 and a trophy
 2nd Prize Book coupons worth HK\$4,000 and a trophy
 3rd Prize Book coupons worth HK\$3,000 and a trophy
 Merit Award Book coupons worth HK\$1,500 and a trophy
- (2) Each winning student will be awarded a certificate of merit, and the teacher in charge from each winning school will be presented with a certificate of thanks.
- (3) Each entrant will be given a certificate of participation in recognition of their efforts.
